

The European security environment is currently characterised by an "Acute" threat level. This is driven by a volatile mix of spillover from Middle Eastern conflicts and persistent hybrid threats from foreign actors. Authorities are observing an increased risk of unconventional warfare, specifically targeting public order and national resilience.

The safety and security of our communities remain our top priority.

To report a suspicious incident or a direct threat within the SASCE (Safer and Stronger Communities in Europe) framework, follow this prioritised communication chain:

1 Immediate Danger



If an incident is in progress (e.g., an intruder, a suspicious package, or a physical assault):

- **Call 112:** This is the universal emergency number across the European Union.
- **Protocol:** State your location, the nature of the threat, and if there are injuries.

2 SASCE Internal Reporting



Once the immediate danger is handled or if you are reporting non-emergency suspicious behaviour (e.g., hostile reconnaissance or online hate speech):

- **Log the incident** via the SASCE Reporting Tool. This data is shared with European law enforcement (Europol) to identify cross-border patterns.
